






















17th International U18 Mountain Running Cup 21-22 June 2024 – Montaña Palentina, Spain

Montaña Palentina will host the International U18 Mountain Running Cup in 2024

Welcome to Palencia, welcome to your home. There is a goal that is essential for the institution I preside over; to reach every corner of the province of Palencia. GENERAL INFORMATION

Located in the heart of Spain, Palencia stands as a captivating combination of rich history, breathtaking scenery and a vibrant cultural tapestry. As the proud host city of the U-18 International Mountain Running Cup, Palencia welcomes athletes, enthusiasts and visitors from around the world to an unforgettable celebration of youth athletics against the backdrop of its picturesque surroundings.

Montaña Palentina is a region in the province of Palencia, in Castilla y León, Spain.

It has a population of 20,527 habitants.

Aguilar de Campoo is the most populated urban centre, with around 6,800 inhabitants.

Farming and agriculture (to a lesser extent) have been the dominant traditional activities..

At the end of the XIX century, there was a sudden prosperity in some localities due to the appearance of coal mining (the Palencia mining basin is entirely within the region), although this activity has practically disappeared in recent years..

The chemical and agri-food industries should also be highlighted; within the latter, the biscuit factories in Aguilar de Campoo are the most important industry in the area.

ARRIVALS

Every team arrives on Thursday 20 June, except for teams with more than 4 hours of flight time, which may arrive on Wednesday 19 June.

Teams will be met there by representatives of the LOC

Teams will be transported from the airport Madrid Barajas to their accommodation by buses or minibus.

The ride is of about 3,30 h

If your team would arrive to a different airport then please discuss this with the race organization in order to arrange an alternative shuttle transfer.

The LOC will pay for the accommodation of the teams in the following way

- * For a maximum of 3 male runners and 3 female runners per delegation
- * For one official per delegation of 3 runners or less, and 2 officials for delegations of 4 runners or more.
- * For 3 nights (Thursday, Friday and Saturday)

If additional persons are included in the team, the additional costs will be borne by each country.

The cost per additional team member (nights):

70 euros for accommodation in a triple room, 80 euros in a double room or 100 euros in a single room (price per night and per person), full board, VAT included.

* All participants must be listed on the Final Registration form in order to ensure adequate accommodation for all participants.

The final account for accommodation attributable to each Member Federation will be based on the numbers declared in the Final Entries and will be paid in full, regardless of any subsequent reduction in the actual number of athletes and/or officials.

CEREMONIES

OPENING CEREMONY:

It will take place on Friday 21 June, from 17:30 hours, in the Plaza Mayor of the town of Aguilar de Campoo.

The teams of countries will be summoned at 17:15 h. in the Patio del Colegio San Gregorio (See photo), for the departure of the parade of nations that will end in the main square for the opening ceremony.























FLOWER CEREMONY:

It will take place on Saturday 22nd June, after the two races at the finish line.

The medals for the open race will also be awarded afterwards.



AWARDS CEREMONY and CLOSING CEREMONY:

It will take place on Saturday 22 June, from 17:30 hours in the Plaza Mayor in the town of Aguilar de Campoo.

At the end of the awards ceremony, a closing party will be held for all athletes with live music.

ACCREDITATION

General:

Accreditation will be obtained at the Race Office located at the TIC; Public Library "Bernardo del Carpio",

Each team member will receive an accreditation card, which must be worn at all times and should be clearly visible.

Accreditation Procedure:

Accreditation cards will be prepared in advance, based on the information provided by the participating federation in the final entries. The Team Leader will be responsible for collecting the accreditation cards of all team members upon arrival. Team Leaders are requested to take the athletes' passports or IDs to the Accreditation Centre in order to allow verification of the participants' age and nationality..

Access Areas for Teams:

All team accreditation cards will allow access to the warm-up area, lunchs, changing facilities and shuttle bus service. Only athletes who are directly involved in the competition will have access to the call room and to the course. Separate cards will be issued for the Team Leaders, for access to the information available in the Race Office / Technical Information Centre (TIC).

Loss of Accreditation:

Any lost or damaged accreditation card should be reported to LOC or to the Accreditation Centre.

Duplicate cards can be obtained where proof of identity can be established.

ARRIVAL

Pick up at the airport by staff of the organisation and accompaniment during the journey from Madrid Barajas airport to Aguilar de Campoo (3:30 hours).)

RETURN

Sunday 23 June; time depending on the return flight.

No need for transport, the distance is within walking distance.





CIRCUIT and RACE REVIEW

Transport and organisation staff will pick you up at the hotel, both on the outward and return journeys.

BARRUELO DE SANTULLAN

16 kilometres from Aguilar de Campoo

THE RACE

Saturday 22nd June:

10h00 Open Race: School Trail mountain palentina- medal ceremony (start/finish area).

11h00: U18 Cup - Girls' race - max 4 to compete and 3 per team will score for nationality

11h50: U18 Cup - Boys race - max 4 to compete and 3 per team will score per nationality.

The course is a loop of 6 km and 290 m of elevation gain.

The terrain is mainly meadows and forests.





















WARMING UP

The warm-up will take place around the start/finish area.

Athletes will place the clothes they have taken off in the specific boxes identified with the respective country code inside the Call Room. These will be collected after the race in the specific area.

CALL ROOM

It is the responsibility of team leaders to ensure that their athletes are aware of the Call Room entry deadline. Athletes arriving late may be excluded from participation in the event. All athletes must report to the Call Room from 20 minutes before their respective event, but no later than 10 minutes before the start. The following checks will be carried out on equipment which must comply with the WA Advertising and Competition Rules.

STARTER COMMANDS

All instructions will be given in English. The command is: "On your marks!" followed by a shot from the starter's pistol.

REFRESHMENT POINTS

There is a refreshment point in the call room area for the start and finish line.

In the event of high temperatures, a refreshment point will be available at approximately kilometre 3.

PROTESTS and APPEALS

Protests shall be handled in accordance with WA Technical Rule 8. In the first instance, protests must be presented orally to the Referee by the athlete himself or by a responsible official acting on his behalf (Rule 8.3).

Protests concerning the result or conduct of a race must be made within 30 minutes of the official announcement of the result of that race (protest at the finish area). Any written appeal to the Jury of Appeal must be signed by a responsible official on behalf of the athlete and lodged at the finish area within 30 minutes of the official announcement of the decision made by the Referee.

When submitting the appeal form, a deposit of 100 Euros must be paid. If the protest is unsuccessful, the deposit will not be refunded. The decision of the Jury will be communicated in writing in the TIC..


















































COMPETITION

Entries:

Every WMRA Member may enter one (1) team for each event. A team can be composed of 4 (four) athletes, the best three of them scoring. A Federation could enter up to 5 boys and 5 girls (including one reserve). Only the host nation is permitted to enter a second team.

The competition is limited to athletes born in 2007 and 2008. No athletes aged less than 16 or more than 17 years on 31 December 2024 can compete.

Although the WMRA International Under 18 Mountain Running Cup is basically a team competition, individual entries may be accepted..

Final Confirmation

Team Leaders or their representatives must confirm the names of those competitors already entered who will actually take part in the competition. Forms for the final declaration and confirmation will be distributed to each delegation during accreditation. These forms must be completed and returned immediately or no later than 15:00 on Friday 21th June 2024.

Final start lists will be ready for collection together with the bibs after the Technical Meeting.

Scoring

Each race shall be scored separately. Each team's score shall be determined by the aggregate of the places of its 3 (three) athletes. Teams shall be classified according to their scores, the team in each race having the lowest score being the winner, and so on. A tie shall be decided in favor of the team whose last scoring athlete finishes nearest to first place. A team with fewer than 3 (three) finishing athletes shall not be counted in the teams' classification. No adjustments to teams' places shall be made in respect of non-scoring team members or athletes participating as individuals.

Competition Bibs

Each competitor receives 2 competition bibs. The bibs shall be worn according to WA Technical Rule 5.7. The competition bibs may not been cut, bent or covered in any way. The competition bibs will be distributed immediately after the Technical Meeting.

Competition Clothing

Competitors must wear the Federation's official team clothing. WA Rule 5.1 & 5.7 will be strictly applied. Please make sure to follow the latest version of the WA Advertising Regulations in force at the time of the event. Clothing and items not conforming to this rule and the current WA Advertising Regulations will be removed or taped at the Call Room. Team clothing must be uniform. A competitor wearing any other clothing will have no access to the competition area and will not be allowed to compete. This rule applies both to competition clothing (vest, shorts and tights) as well as to tracksuits.





MEDICAL SERVICES

The LOC will provide medical assistance to the teams, during the competition, to the spectators. A medical tent with a first aid team will operate near the finish line.

For all other situations it is advisable to have accident insurance and/or medical assistance.

Doping controls may be carried out in accordance with the WA Regulations and under the supervision of the WMRA Delegate.

STREAMING

Live broadcast of the races, both in English and Spanish, with cameras on the course and continuous monitoring of the front runners.
